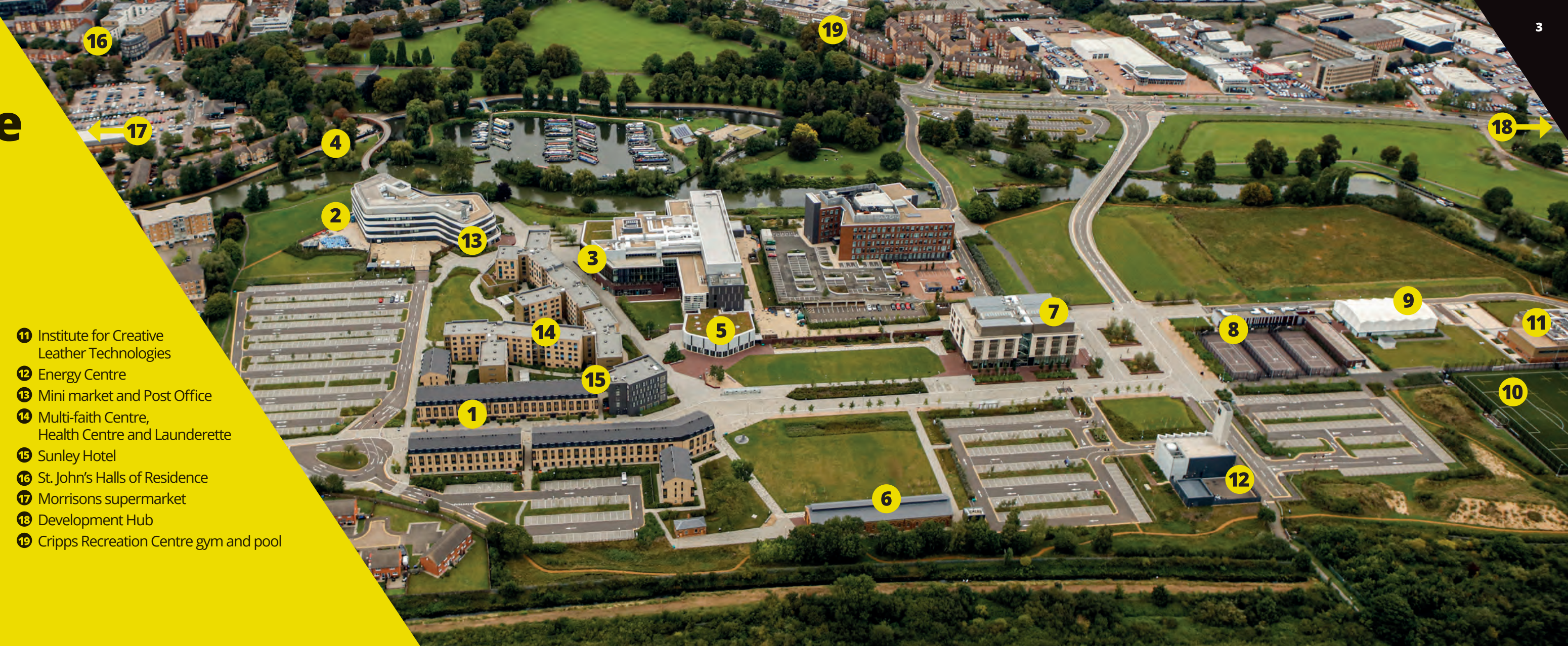

VALUE FOR MONEY.

UON offers better value for money in the three biggest areas of university expenses – tuition fees, scholarship schemes and accommodation – than 95% of our main competitors included in the study when all three factors are considered*.

Tuition fees



At UON, not only are you paying fees at the lower end of the UK range**, but you could save even more as our single fee policy means you won't have to pay a higher fee if you study a subject that is expensive to teach or is very popular, like Engineering, Computing or Law, for example‡.

International scholarships



We award International Scholarships of up to 30% based on academic achievement. All courses are included and there is no limit to the number we award. They are automatic, so you don't even have to apply and what's more, the scholarship will apply to all taught years of your course, meaning you could save almost one full year's tuition fees over the course of a three-year degree.

At both undergraduate and postgraduate level, UON has the lowest total fee of all of our main competitors, after each university's maximum scholarship is deducted*.

YOUR JOURNEY TO UON.

You can choose the right place to start your studies at UON. Year one of a Bachelor's or Master's degree may be the right choice for most people, but not for everyone, so we've made it possible for you to start your academic journey at the point that best matches your previous academic achievement.

Integrated Foundation Year



We will automatically recommend our Integrated Foundation Year if you apply for a Bachelor's degree with some A Level equivalents, but still don't meet the entry requirements for your course.

Two-Year Intensive



A two year accelerated degree is available in Law, ideal for those seeking faster progression of a career in this field, allowing you to complete your degree in two years rather than the standard three.

Top-Ups



If you have already studied at university level, possibly at one of our partner universities, and have completed the equivalent of two years of a UK degree, you may be eligible for a one-year Top-Up to a full UK Bachelor's degree.

Advanced Entry through Accreditation of Prior Learning (APL)

If you would like to transfer to UON and use credits earned at another university to gain exemptions from part of one of our courses, you should follow the normal application route and mention in your Supporting Statement that you would like to be considered for advanced entry. Attach your transcript and module descriptions and our Admissions Tutors will make a judgement on the best point for you to start.

Pre-Sessional English



If your academic qualifications meet our entry requirement but you still need to develop your English Language ability, we will recommend one of our PEP programmes. There's no need to apply separately, as our Admissions Team will review your existing IELTS score and advise on which programme you need.
