



## Research for change

Collaborating with partners worldwide, SOAS researchers address challenges and strive for a more equal and just world.



Existing anti-corruption approaches of top-down driven enforcement have often delivered poor results in developing countries. The SOAS Anti-Corruption Evidence (ACE) research project aims to develop anti-corruption strategies that move away from top-down enforcement and towards peer-group support for anti-corruption. The programme operates primarily in Bangladesh and Nigeria but has also worked in Tanzania, Lebanon, Pakistan, Indonesia and Malawi, and includes a network of 27 co-creating research partner organizations across these countries.

## Using immersive VR to reconstruct the past

The Hashima Virtual Reality Project brings together an interdisciplinary team of historians, game developers, and heritage preservationists to teleport users to an immersive experience of life on the Island of Hashima. The Island, which is a UNESCO World Heritage site off the coast of Nagasaki city is both a symbol of Japan's industrial heritage and a contested site of historical memory. The project reconstructs and gives guided tours of this UNESCO World Heritage site and will become an interactive gaming experience of the island from the 1920s to the 1970s.



## Amplifying the carceral experiences of marginalised communities around the world

The Carceral Policy, Policing and Race Project seeks to amplify the carceral experiences of marginalised communities around the world and to dig deeper into the various meanings and manifestations of carcerality itself. Led by the Rt Hon David Lammy MP, it aims to uncover the strikingly similar carceral colonial character of societies around the world. It asks what it would mean to "decolonise" systems of criminal justice around the world.

## Transforming public understanding of The Epic of Gilgamesh

The Epic of Gilgamesh is the oldest long poem in history. Professor Andrew George began work translating the Epic in 1985 as a young lecturer at SOAS and continued his work on it for more than 35 years. His 2019 Penguin Classics edition is the definitive translation for non-academic readers and includes the most recent discoveries of text. By recovering Gilgamesh for modern readers Professor George has put the masterpiece of Babylonian literature where it belongs squarely in the cultural limelight.




