





Making your application for 2025 entry

- All applicants for an undergraduate degree programme at SOAS must apply through UCAS online at: www.ucas.com.
- You can apply for up to five courses on the UCAS application.
- The equal consideration deadline for the majority of students is in January 2025. If you are also applying to Oxford or Cambridge, the deadline is October 2024.

Entry requirements

The entry requirements vary from programme to programme. In addition to A levels, we accept a wide range of alternative UK and international qualifications. For joint honours degrees with varying entry requirements, the higher grade requirement applies. Check the website for the full list of requirements.



Alternative qualifications

SOAS welcomes applications from students studying a range of qualifications. Our admissions team take a holistic approach to applications, assessing on a case by case basis.

Qualifications considered for entry include access courses, BTEC level 3 or combinations of qualifications equivalent to three A levels at appropriate grades. Some departments will consider the relevance of the qualification to the chosen programme of study.

Disabled students

We give equal consideration to all applicants and welcome applications from students with disabilities. You are encouraged to disclose any disability you may have, as this will help us work with you and plan for your support needs and any adjustments the team may need to make

Mature students, deferred entry and transfers

SOAS is happy to consider applicants who wish to take a year out, want to transfer from another UK university or are returning to study after a break.

English language and academic preparation

All applicants must be able to show that their English is of a high enough standard to successfully engage with and complete their course at SOAS. If you need to take an English language test, you can still apply for your degree, but we will include evidence of language requirements as part of your offer conditions. In all cases, we consider the most recent test evidence.
