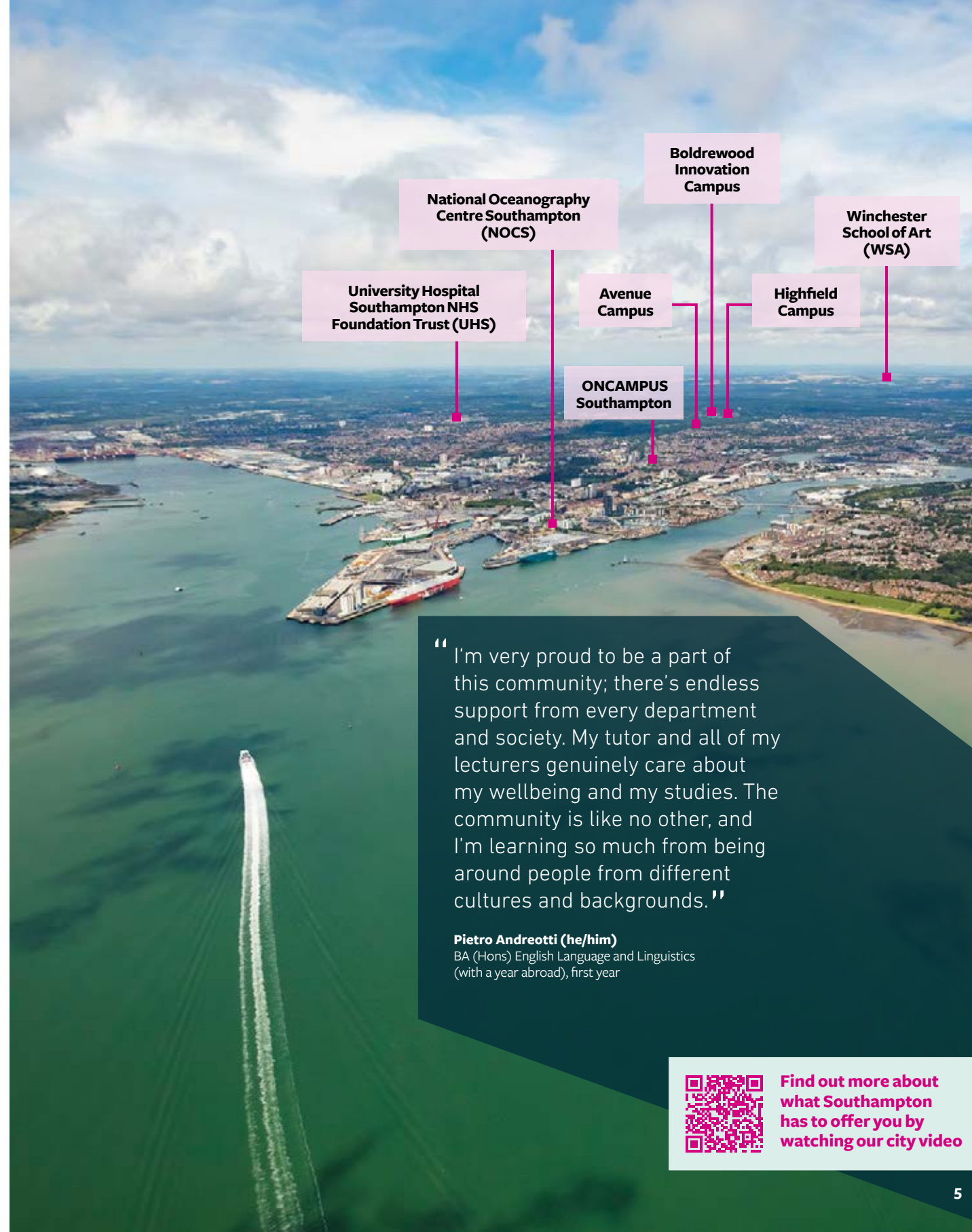

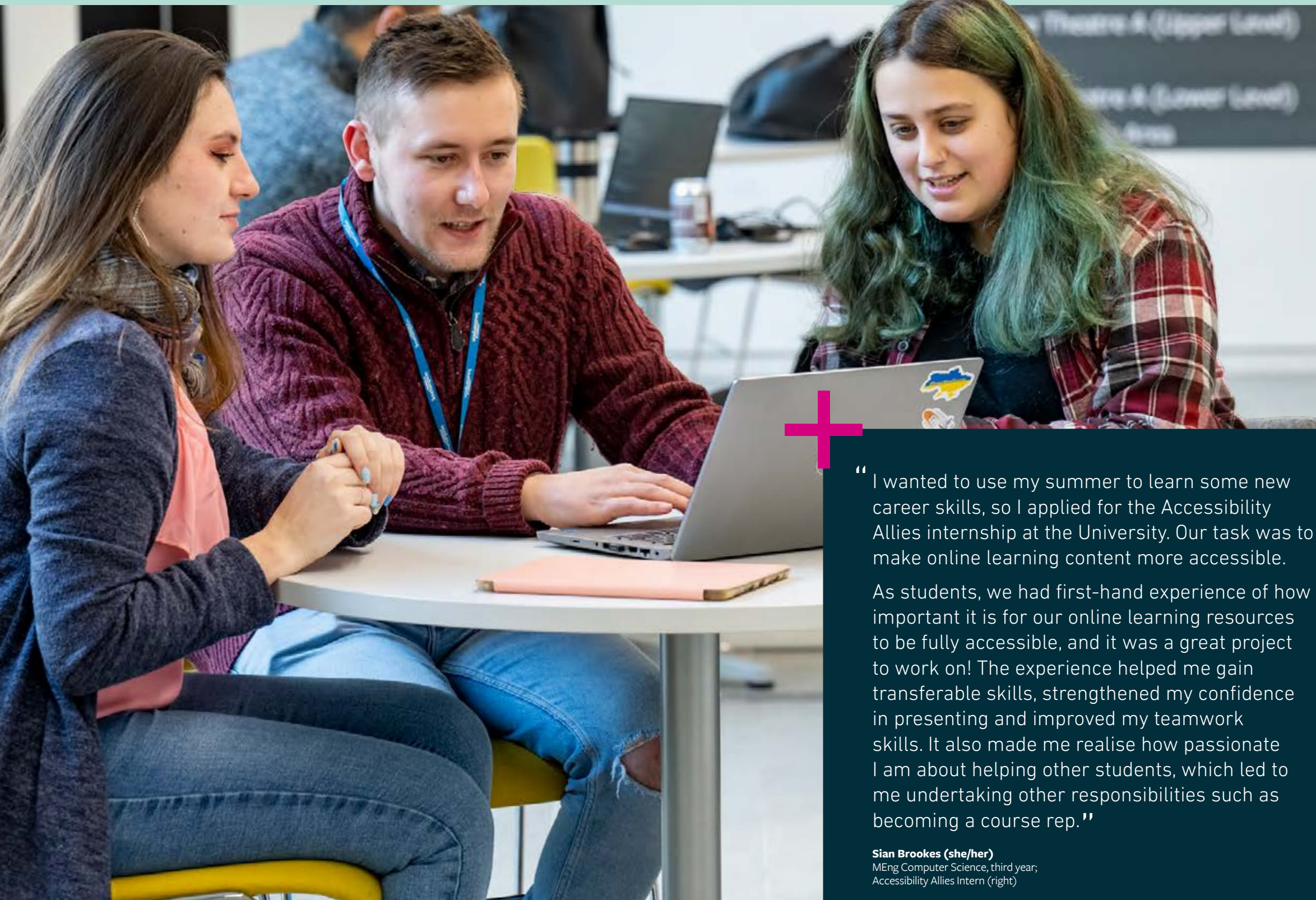

INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

Join our international student community on the south coast of the UK.

Living and learning in a different country is a big step. From application support to helping you on arrival, we can help you settle into your new life in the UK.

Our International Office

Our friendly International Office staff are based in the UK and across the world. We regularly travel to meet potential students at exhibitions and events.

We're always happy to meet remotely or face-to-face and answer any questions you may have about living and studying here in Southampton.

Official overseas representatives

We work with several overseas agencies who support students with applications to the UK.

There is no obligation for you to use one of these agencies to apply to the University. A full list is available on our website.

English language requirements and support

You'll need to show that you have sufficient knowledge of the English language before arriving at Southampton.

Applicants who require a visa to study in the UK will additionally need to satisfy the University's English language requirements in order to be 'sponsored' by the University.

All English language requirements for our courses are on our website.

Our pre-sessional courses help you prepare before you start your course, and you can also access academic English language support during your studies.

Visas

You will need to find out about the UK's immigration procedures well in advance of your arrival.

Our specialist Visa and Immigration Student Advice Service (VISAS) can help advise and support you. You can find out more on our website.

Fees

We are one of only a few UK universities who offer fixed fees for international students. We also make it easy for you, your sponsor or funding body to pay your fees directly to us online. See page 48 for more fees information.

Accommodation

We guarantee a place in University accommodation for your first year, as long as you fulfil the full criteria. See page 28 for more details.

Welcome Programme

Our free Welcome Programme for international students will help you settle into life in the UK and at the University before your studies begin in September. Meet other undergraduate students, attend talks, socialise and explore our campuses and the city.

Meet and Greet

We'll meet you at London Gatwick, London Heathrow or Southampton Airport and transport you directly to your accommodation with our free Meet and Greet Airport Collection Service. This is open to all new international students upon arrival in January, June, July and September.

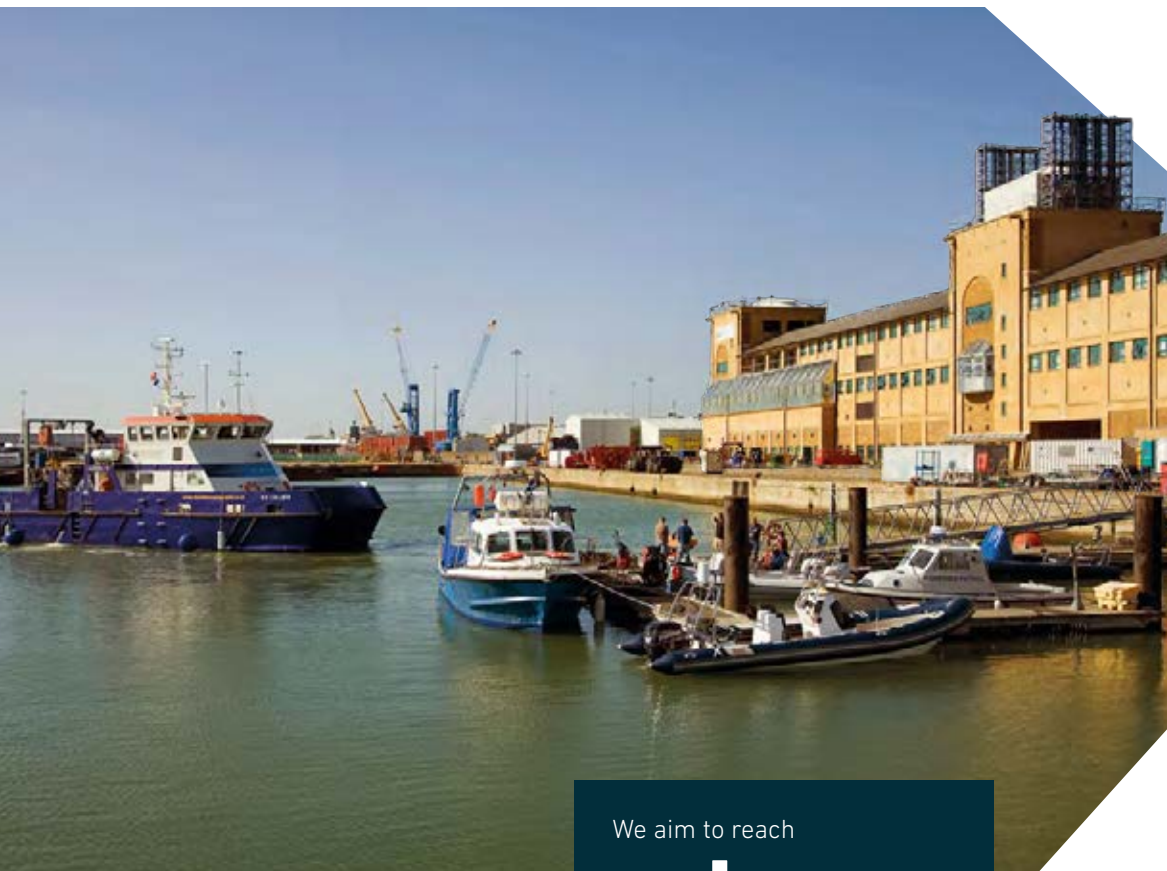

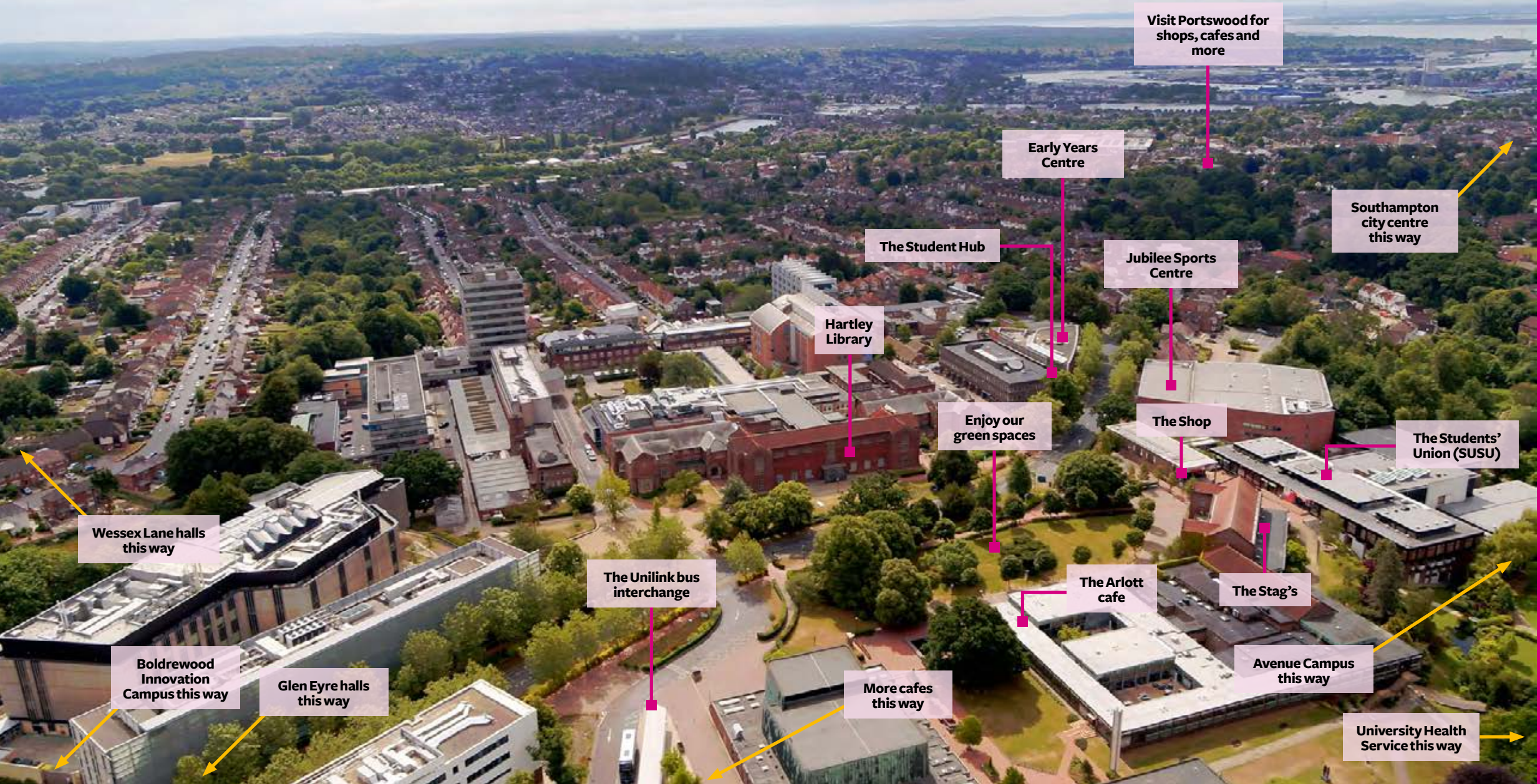

HIGHFIELD CAMPUS

Highfield Campus is the heart of our University. If you study in Southampton, you're likely to spend a lot of time here, with plenty of places to study, socialise, exercise and find support.

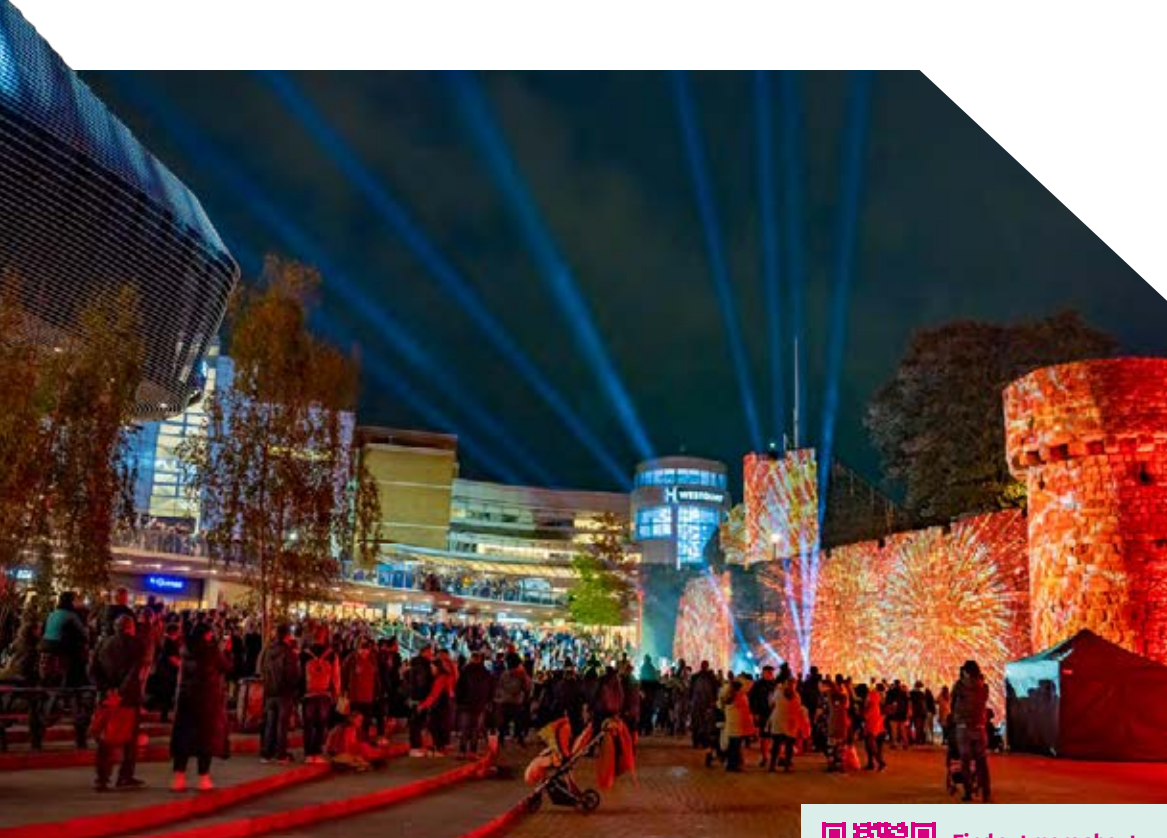

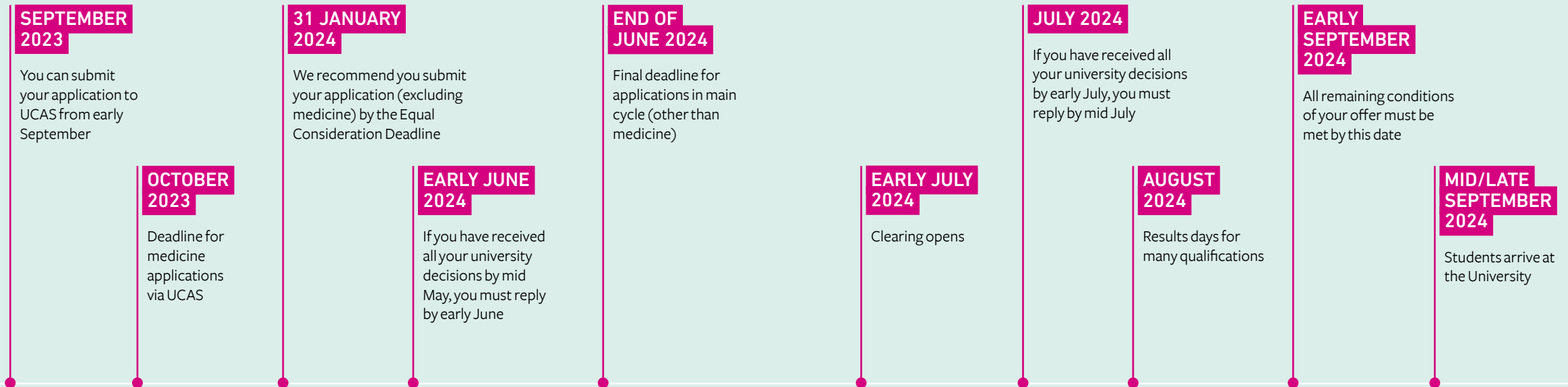

Before you apply

- + Check our website for the latest course options and up-to-date entry requirements.
- + Familiarise yourself with the application timeline.

How and when to apply

- + Applications should be submitted via UCAS (www.ucas.com).
- + Our institution code is S27 and our code name is SOTON.
- + Applications can be submitted from early September.
- + The deadline for medicine is 16 October 2023.
- + The Equal Consideration Deadline for all other programmes is 31 January 2024.
- + The deadline for applications is 30 June 2024, although we strongly advise you to apply as early as possible as some courses may no longer have vacancies after the January equal consideration date.

How we assess your application

- + We are committed to considering every application fairly.
- + We consider your merit and potential by assessing your whole application.
- + We look at:
 - + your qualifications
 - + your actual and/or predicted exam grades
 - + your personal statement
 - + your reference

Deferred entry

- + We accept deferred entry for most courses, but not all.
- + This option is ideal if you wish to take a gap year.
- + We consider deferred applications in the same way as other applications.
- + Deferred applicants must satisfy any offer conditions by early September in the application year.

Equal opportunities and contextual admissions

We are committed to ensuring that all students, regardless of background, are encouraged to apply to study with us.

As well as your qualifications and grades, we use contextual information to recognise your achievements and potential alongside your background and experience.

Every applicant who is flagged through contextual admissions, and meets the academic criteria, will be made an offer which is lower than the typical offer for that programme.

Entry qualifications

We carefully and fairly consider all relevant qualifications.

We welcome applications from candidates offering a broad range of Level 3 qualifications. These include:

- + GCE A levels and AS levels
- + Scottish Highers and Advanced Highers

- + the International Baccalaureate Diploma
- + Access to HE Diplomas
- + BTECs
- + many European and international qualifications, and combinations of qualifications

We also accept the Extended Project Qualification (EPQ). We were the first university to formally recognise the EPQ, which offers a head start in independent study. If you are studying an EPQ, you will receive a reduced offer alongside your typical offer. See page 68 for more information.

You will need to satisfy our general entrance requirements (currently a GCSE in each of English and mathematics at grade C or 4) or University-recognised equivalent qualification, in addition to the specific requirements for your chosen course.

Young and mature applicants

We welcome applications from people under 18 and mature applicants (aged 21 and over). More details can be found online.

Applicants with disabilities or specific learning needs

FEES AND FUNDING

Going to university is a significant investment, so it's important you have all the information you need to make the right choice.

As an undergraduate student, you'll need to pay an annual tuition fee to the University for your programme of study. This varies depending on whether your fee status is classed as 'home' or 'overseas'.

Home student fees

The University will set fees for 2024/2025 subject to any conditions imposed by the government*.

The latest fees information is available online.

Overseas student fees

We are one of only a few UK universities to offer international students the same fixed fee for each year of your course.

You'll pay the same fixed fee for each year of your programme, except for programmes where a combination of clinical and non-clinical fees applies. In these instances, the non-clinical fixed fee will apply for years one and two, and the clinical fixed fee will apply for the remainder of the programme.

As with other UK medical courses, these fees may be subject to an additional charge for clinical placement in the NHS, decided by the UK government.

If you are starting any University-run Foundation Year, you will pay less for your Foundation Year than for the rest of your integrated degree.

What's included in my fees?

Depending on your chosen course, your tuition fees may cover compulsory costs such as field trips and laboratory clothing.

However, you may still need to fund certain course costs yourself such as books, studying abroad and any extra materials and equipment.

Please check with the Admissions team for more details about what's included for specific courses.

What if I defer my place?

If you defer your place, you will pay the tuition fees set for the academic year you start your studies.

Student loans

If you are a UK student starting a higher education course, you can apply for loans to help pay for both fees and living costs.

Tuition Fee Loan

If you're a UK student, you won't have to pay any tuition fees before or during your studies. Instead, you can take out a student loan for fees.

You can borrow the full cost of the tuition fee charged for your programme of study. The amount you receive does not depend on your financial circumstances, and currently the loan is only repayable once you are earning over a specific amount per year.

Maintenance Loan

If you're a UK student, you can also take out a student loan to help with living costs. The amount you borrow depends on your circumstances and, like the Tuition Fee Loan, is only repayable once you earn over a specific amount per year.

Student loans are issued by Student Finance on behalf of the UK government – they are not commercial loans. Interest is charged on a student loan from the date you receive it to the date you pay it off.

Scholarships, bursaries and funding

We know that funding your studies and additional living costs can sometimes be worrying. We offer a range of financial support to help ease your concerns and open more opportunities.

We work with our students to ensure the financial support we provide is as valuable and reactive as possible.

Scholarships

We offer a variety of scholarships and progression awards to the most talented students across our subject areas. You don't need to apply separately; a decision will be made by the University based on your application and qualifications.

International scholarships

We offer scholarships to international students across a range of subjects. Some of these are awarded automatically based on academic merit*. You will be made aware of the process required for scholarships that do require an application. Many international organisations also offer financial assistance which you may be eligible for.

The Ignite Programme

Our Ignite Programme offers bursaries, scholarships and funding options to undergraduate students from underrepresented backgrounds. This support has been made possible by the generous support of our alumni community.

Sanctuary Scholarship

Our Sanctuary Scholarship currently supports two students per year seeking sanctuary in the UK. This opportunity covers tuition fees, a bursary, and additional support with accommodation where needed*.

Talented Athlete Scholarship Scheme (TASS)

This Scheme supports elite athletes who wish to progress with a formal academic course and maintain involvement in performance sports. Students are selected by the national governing body of their sport.

Bursaries

We offer a range of bursaries designed to help UK undergraduate students in the most financial need. These include:

- + the Southampton Bursary Scheme
- + Care Leaver and Estranged Student Bursaries
- + the University Sports Bursary Scheme

Additional support

We provide financial support for students who can show they are in financial difficulty that could cause them to leave higher education. This comes from the Student Support Fund and philanthropic gifts from University alumni and supporters.

There may also be some extra, non-repayable help available if you either have a disability or have any dependants.

We offer many generous fee waivers and bursaries for eligible students. For students from lower income families, these financial packages will be based on household income supplied to us by the Student Loans Company.

Finding temporary work

If you would like to find a temporary job to help with your living costs, our Careers, Employability and Student Enterprise service and Uniworkforce team advertise part-time and temporary jobs and internships available within the University and with many local employers.

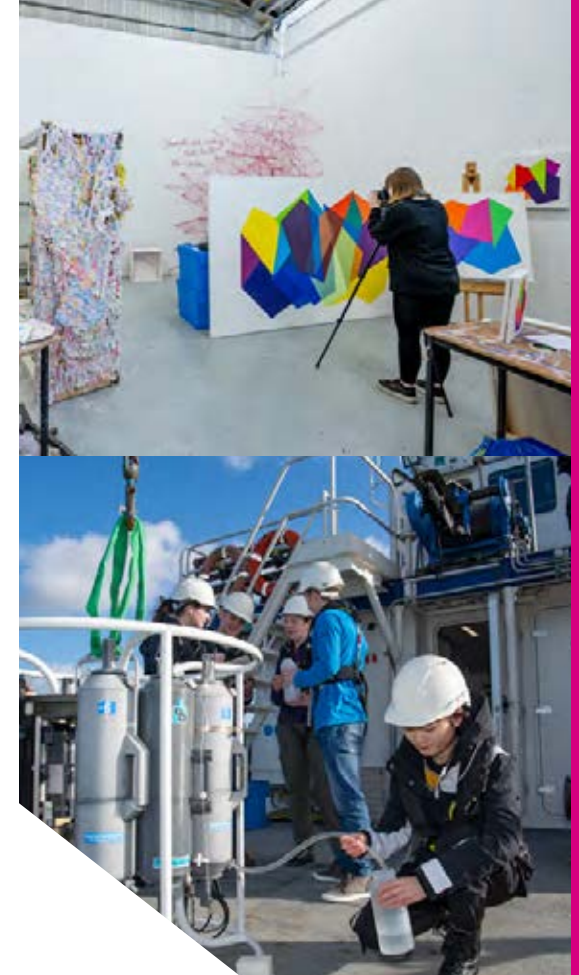

COURSES

With over 400 courses on offer, many of which also provide work placements or opportunities to study abroad, you'll find the right option to set you on the right path for your future career.

There are lots of ways you can study for a degree with us. We offer multiple study options to help you get the knowledge, skills and experience you need.

Three-year degrees

Most undergraduate degree courses in England take three years to complete. At Southampton, all our three-year degrees are bachelor's awards, and if you pass with a second-class grade or above, your award will include honours.

Integrated master's degree

An integrated master's degree is a four-year programme, which combines undergraduate and postgraduate study into a single course. Many of our subject areas give you this study option, and it means that you will graduate with a master's degree.

Integrated master's degrees have their own UCAS code and can be applied for in the same way as our three-year degrees. However, it may also be possible to transfer to an integrated master's programme once you have started a three-year course.

Studying abroad

We offer some of our undergraduate courses with a year abroad. These opportunities will enrich your academic learning by experiencing a different academic environment in a vibrant cultural context and develop your language and communication skills.

If you choose to study a degree within Arts and Humanities, Southampton Business School or Southampton Law School, you can study abroad for a full year. This takes place in your third year of a four-year integrated degree programme. In most cases these degrees will have their own UCAS code and have been highlighted in a separate row in the course listings table.

If you choose to study any of our other Social Sciences subjects and courses within Environmental and Life Sciences* and Engineering and Physical Sciences** you are able to study an optional single semester abroad. You would undertake this semester in your second or third year of study depending on your degree.

Degrees with an industrial placement

We offer some of our undergraduate courses with an industrial placement. These opportunities will help you develop your professional skills and workplace experience in an industry of your choice, while also allowing you to 'test-drive' a career and make a more informed decision about what you want to do after you graduate. In most cases these degrees will have their own UCAS code and have been highlighted in a separate row in our course listings table. For more information on these courses, please see individual course pages online.

Degrees with a year in employment

You may be eligible to apply to undertake the University's Year in Employment (YiE). This offers you another great opportunity to complete a work placement and will help you develop work-based skills. You will be able to choose a placement in any sector you like, whether it is aligned to your degree or in a completely new area of interest.

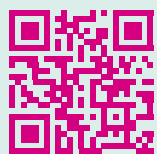
Degrees with a foundation year

We offer some of our undergraduate courses with a foundation year of study. This additional year is designed to give you extra skills and knowledge to support your learning before you progress on to degree-level studies.

Courses with an integrated foundation year can offer an alternative entry route to your chosen undergraduate course.

* Health Sciences students cannot undertake a semester exchange, but short-term summer options are sometimes available, subject to academic approval and the student's academic schedule.

** Opportunities differ for all subjects within Engineering and Physical Sciences. Please check with the Faculty. Full-year exchange is available to students within Physics through the CERN and Harvard programmes. Chemistry students may spend six months abroad under the MChem lab placement opportunity. Single semester or full-year exchange are unavailable to Electronic and Computer Science students.

International Foundation Year

Our international foundation programmes are specifically designed for international students. Studying a foundation programme enables you to study a course with us if the requirements for direct entry are not met. Through ONCAMPUS Southampton's undergraduate foundation programmes, which you apply directly to ONCAMPUS Southampton for, you can increase your knowledge of your chosen subject area and improve your English and study skills.

The ONCAMPUS Southampton Centre is in the city centre, close to our Highfield Campus. Successful completion of your ONCAMPUS Southampton undergraduate foundation programme guarantees you entry to a Southampton undergraduate degree, subject to meeting the specified progression criteria.

Programme approval and review

Programme Approval is the process by which the University checks its programmes of study against academic quality and standards expectations. Any taught programme leading to a University of Southampton award is required to go through this process.

Programme Review occurs every five years and is the process the University undertakes to reflect on the delivery and student experience of existing taught programmes and plan for the next cycle of programme enhancement.

These processes ensure that the University's high standards for quality of teaching are consistently upheld. The full Programme Approval and Review process can be found in the University's Quality Handbook on our website.

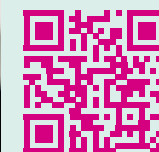

Typical offer

International Baccalaureate (IB)

Most of our courses accept IB as an entry qualification. The level expected for each degree is detailed in the course listings table. Please check individual course pages on our website for full details of our entry requirements.

Required subjects

Some of our courses require you to have studied certain subjects at A level. If this column has a tick in the course listings table, refer to the course page on the website to find out if your A levels are part of the requirements.

EPQ offer

An EPQ is an additional qualification you can study alongside your A levels and will mean you could get a reduced offer in addition to your standard A level offer.

There is a reason why the University makes this offer; EPQs aid the transition in learning styles to university and encourage the research and academic skills that you will be using in your degree. EPQ students also tend to achieve better degree outcomes compared to non-EPQ students.

For most of our courses, applicants studying an EPQ will be made two offers: our typical offer based on three A levels, and an alternative where, in exchange for an A or A* in the EPQ, we will reduce the A level requirements by one grade. 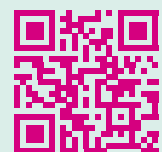
