COURSE LENGTH

Most undergraduate courses at the University of Stirling are four years long, resulting in an Honours degree. Some of our courses offer Advanced Entry routes that enable students to gain exemption from Year 1 or Year 2 of study.





UNDERGRADUATE FEES AND FUNDING

TUITION FEES

Your University fees cover all your teaching, examinations, and enrolment as a student. Individual course fee information can be found on the relevant course pages.

HONOURS YEAR SCHOLARSHIP

Students from England, Wales, Northern Ireland, Republic of Ireland and the EU who successfully progress through Years 1-3 and enter fourth year will be awarded an Honours Scholarship, covering the full cost of the fees in their fourth and final year.

Provided you meet the minimum requirements for your chosen course, we will be able to guarantee you an offer and you may be eligible for an alumni scholarship.

INTO UNIVERSITY OF STIRLING

Working with global education experts INTO, our pathway courses are designed to give you excellent preparation for your University of Stirling degree.

Our dynamic pathway courses, integrated undergraduate and postgraduate degrees, and academic English courses can help you pursue academic success. In some circumstances, students who study with INTO before progressing to their undergraduate or postgraduate degree at Stirling can benefit from only needing to apply for one student visa.

UNDERGRADUATE PATHWAYS

Advanced entry into Year Two of your degree

International Foundation

The International Foundation prepares you for direct entry to Year Two of an undergraduate degree and helps ensure that you meet both the English language and academic entry requirements for your chosen progression degree. This course offers flexibility in choosing your degree and offers students a chance to make a more informed decision on their degree choice.

International Year One

Like the International Foundation, International Year One prepares you for direct entry to Year Two of an undergraduate degree. This is for students who know which degree they wish to study and offers modules tailored to what you want to study at university. This option also offers the convenience of studying both the pathway and degree under one single visa.

Advanced entry into Year Three of your degree

International Diploma

Equivalent to the second year of a Scottish undergraduate degree, the International Diploma focuses on developing your academic and undergraduate research skills, as well as improving your English language ability. On completion, you'll be able to choose a degree and progress to Year Three at the University of Stirling. This course is available to students who have completed a foundation, or have A-Levels (or equivalent) which are not quite up to direct entry level.

International Year Two

As with the International Diploma, this course will develop your undergraduate academic skills while improving your English language ability to progress to Year Three of a University of Stirling degree. The course is for students who know which progression degree they wish to study and offers the convenience of studying both the pathway and degree under one single visa.

Three Term Pre-Masters

The Three Term Pre-Masters is ideal for students who have completed higher level study not equivalent to a UK degree. The course bridges the gap between three year diplomas or university systems not recognised in the UK. Successful completion will allow you to progress onto a Master's degree.

The course will focus on English language, study skills and research skills combined with subject content relevant to your chosen subject area.

Students can combine the Three Term Pre-Masters with a University of Stirling Masters degree if they know which Masters degree they wish to study (only requiring one visa for both parts of the study plan), or take the Three Term Pre-Masters as a standalone qualification and consider their Master's degree study options upon completion (requiring two separate visas).

Two Term Pre-Masters

The Two Term Pre-Masters is a six month course covering English language and study skills. It is ideal for students who have an ordinary degree who may not meet the requirements for direct entry, or who have work experience that they wish to use in lieu of a degree but need to sharpen up their academic skills in order to thrive in their Masters degree.

One Term Pre-Masters

The One Term Pre-Masters course is an intensive three month course covering English language and study skills. It is ideal for students who have substantial work experience relevant to the degree that they wish to study, or a 3rd class honours. The course will allow you to acquire the skills you need to thrive in your Masters degree such as academic English, essay writing, research skills and critical thinking.

PRE-SESSIONAL ENGLISH

Pre-sessional English courses provide a short and intensive preparation in academic English for students who are already academically qualified and are due to start a degree at the University of Stirling. We offer options to study both online or on campus.

10-week Pre-sessional English course

This course can be taken either online or on campus, and is designed to improve your IELTS score by at least 1.0 in one or more subskills.

6-week Pre-sessional English course

This short, intensive course can be taken either online or on campus and is designed to improve your IELTS score by at least 0.5 in one or more subskills.
